Foreword from President & Secretary General

2024 was a year of strong momentum.

It was marked by numerous initiatives aimed at better serving our members, including a review of the ECIIA strategic plan.

We continued to advocate for the crucial role of internal auditors in promoting strong governance and driving business transformation—especially in areas like digitalisation, sustainability, and resilience.

Our outreach and influence have grown significantly. We strengthened our engagement with key stakeholders: the business sector (via European Issuers), external auditors (via Accountancy Europe), and the new standard-setters and regulators (EFRAG, GRI). We also deepened collaboration with the Board of Directors (ecoDa) and Risk Managers (FERMA).

There is growing recognition that internal auditors play a vital role in supporting governing bodies and management in overseeing and responding to new risks and organisational change. However, regulators still largely exclude internal audit from regulatory frameworks—apart from those in the financial sector.

While internal audit is formally embedded in financial regulation, we continue to advocate for broader recognition across all sectors. At the same time, we have reinforced our engagement with the ECB through regular meetings, aiming to ensure that internal auditors in banking are well represented in evolving supervisory discussions, through our contribution to the consultation paper on governance and risk culture.

Looking ahead, 2025 will be a year of uncertainty and change.

A new European Commission and Parliament are now in place, with a clear focus on enhancing European competitiveness and simplifying regulations.

The regulatory landscape continues to evolve rapidly. The Omnibus "Content" Proposal has entered the amendment drafting phase in the European Parliament, a critical step toward shaping future ESG reporting requirements. Meanwhile, the "Stop the Clock" Directive has come into force, extending phase-in periods for Wave 2 and 3 companies under the CSRD and delaying the application of the CS3D for all entities in scope.

In parallel, EFRAG has submitted its Work Programme for the ESRS Review, outlining key actions for the months ahead.

The financial sector, including ESMA, is actively advising the Commission and advocating for better regulatory alignment.

The digital agenda also remains a priority, with the implementation of DORA and the Artificial Intelligence Act presenting both opportunities and challenges. Another key initiative is the EU's effort to strengthen cyber resilience through higher standards and a comprehensive, horizontal approach.

Importantly, the **Global Internal Audit Standards** are now being implemented—bringing new expectations and opportunities for the profession.

Internal auditors must remain agile, ready to adapt to shifting business models and operational tools. Boards, too, must guide governing bodies through a landscape shaped by geopolitical tension, supply chain fragility, and cybersecurity risks—where resilience and foresight are no longer optional but essential.

Let us continue working together toward an internal audit function that is recognised as a key pillar of strong governance and sustainable business—and take this opportunity to thank all our members and volunteers for their unwavering support.

ECIIA's advocacy work spans multiple formats and touchpoints, ensuring strong and continuous engagement with members and European stakeholders:

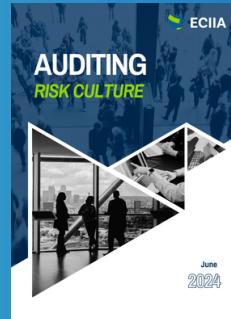
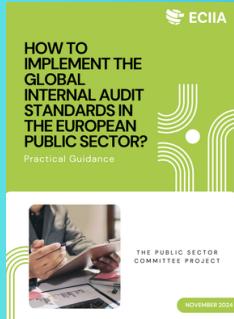

Key Highlights from Publications, Events & Outreach



PUBLICATIONS

In 2024, ECIIA released six publications to support internal auditors in navigating key regulatory developments, governance frameworks, and emerging risks.



Guidance tailored for European public sector auditors to apply the new Global Internal Audit Standards effectively.

A practical guide to help internal auditors prepare for the 2025 DORA deadline, with a focus on digital resilience and cybersecurity.

Outlines the impact of the EU's new AML/CFT package and the upcoming Anti-Money Laundering Authority (AMLA).

Explores how risk culture has evolved since 2008 and provides insight into supervisory expectations and challenges in auditing culture.

Developed with key partners, this publication helps boards strengthen ESG governance with real-world examples and advice.

A trusted reference for audit planning, highlighting top risks like cybersecurity, AI, human capital, and climate change.



EVENTS & FORUMS

We created meaningful spaces for dialogue between internal auditors, regulators, and stakeholders – both virtually and in person.

Webinars

We hosted 11 webinars, gathering over 3000 participants, supporting our publications and spotlighting key issues for the internal audit community across Europe.

ECIIA Banking Forum

Organised with the ECB, this forum explored the impact of AI on the internal audit profession, bringing together regulators and practitioners.

ECIIA Conference – Budapest

Our flagship conference gathered over 500 professionals to exchange insights on governance, ethics, and innovation in internal auditing.

We deepened our engagement with European institutions, National Institutes, and global partners to ensure alignment and strong representation.

Advocacy Plan

- Launch new factsheets, position papers, and stakeholder engagement materials
- Improve monitoring and response to emerging EU legislative developments

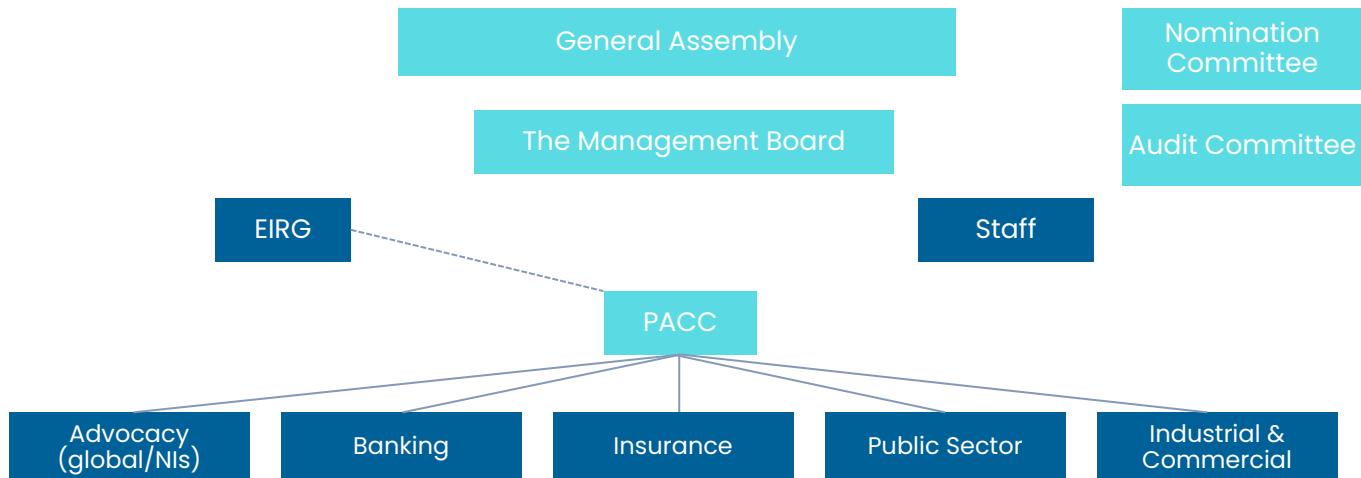
Internal Plan
